God Works Through Authority

Hebrews 13:17 - Obey them that have the rule over you, and submit yourselves: for they watch for your souls, as they that must give account, that they may do it with joy, and not with grief: for that [is] unprofitable for you. (Read also Romans 13:1 and 2 John 1:9)

All scripturally agreeable authority is ordained by our Creator. There are spiritual purposes and blessings when operating under proper authority. By proper I mean not contradictory to God's word. By the same token there are consequences and risk in rebellion and rejecting authority. The enemy certainly monitors our level of obedience and submission. Our human nature is naturally inclined to resist authority and to reject same in rebellion. The power of God is apparent in working through authority over us. With authority, however, comes accountability and responsibility. As we function under authority we receive the blessing of spiritual protection from destructive temptations.

Ordained authority is often used by the Lord in building our character and permits growth in godly wisdom. Direction and decisions often become clearer when working under authority. I must emphasize that all human authority is delegated and intended as a blessing and protection. Authority never implies superiority but does carry accountability.

The instrument of Emmaus has been created by godly men and women through the guidance, direction and power of the Holy Spirit of God. It has been made available to us through the Upper Room. The many "facets" surrounding the three day weekend of this crash course in Christianity are in place because of the experienced direction of these brothers and sisters in Christ. Authority thus filters down through the Almighty---The Upper Room—Central Emmaus board of directors---Team selection committee----Weekend lay and spiritual directors. Please remember the blessings in obedience and the risks otherwise as we continue in our daily journey of faith.

Kairos Torch

Dear Christian Family,

My name is Danny Brunt. For a number of years now my wife Marilyn and I have been involved with Kairos Torch Prison Ministry.

Torch is a mentoring ministry dedicated to serve youthful offenders. We want these youth to know that there is a Christian Community that cares about them and their needs.

KAIROS TORCH begins with weekend retreats intended to help strengthen the family unit and encourage small support groups. The weekends held each year provide a secure place for young people to share their struggles. We then meet with the young people twice a month for mentoring. This is the main focus of the ministry, not just the weekend. KAIROS means ...GOD'S SPECIAL TIME...and in the lives of these youthful offenders we know it will be a special time for them.

I want to invite you to an introductory session for KAIROS TORCH to be held on Saturday morning October 17, 2015, 9:00 AM, at Anderson United Methodist Church in Jackson, MS. This 3 hour "Torch 101" will introduce prospective volunteers to the ministry and encourage all to get involved as we begin this program at Central Mississippi Correctional Facility in Pearl, MS. Male volunteers must be a minimum of 24 years of age while female volunteers must be a minimum of 28.

Gay Taft, a Torch National Trainer from the Orlando area, will conduct this training for us.
